Alpha Sigma Nu Magazine to debut this fall

We are very excited to be launching a new magazine this October. As communications evolve, we at Alpha Sigma Nu must adapt our ways of communicating with members to meet you where you are - and where the trends are. The magazine format will allow us more space to share important Jesuit news, Ignatian resources, Alpha Sigma Nu highlights, and member stories. We poured over the data from our alumni survey and heard your collective interest in learning about your fellow members, reading news and finding resources to keep you connected to the Jesuits and





Ignatian values. This format has a longer shelf-life, meaning you might find yourself going back to the magazine over time to more thoroughly read the articles you initially skimmed or to reference a resource that piqued your interest.

As we know ever more communications are moving online, we will also be offering the magazine in an online format that makes your reading experience more efficient and enjoyable. Easily read and share individual features and find links right from the issue to important accompanying content.

In this first issue, we will focus on the challenge from Stephen Sundborg, SJ, President of Seattle University, at the 2018 Triennial Conference to discern what it means to be the *JESUIT* honor society. My journey in Jesuit education began as a high-school student, and at the start, I had very little idea what distinguished a Jesuit from the priests I knew from my home parish. Early in my freshman year, my Theology teacher referred to himself and his brother Jesuits as the "Navy SEALs of priests," ready to go on a moment's notice and minister wherever and to whomever needs them the most. Eighteen years in Jesuit education later, and now the principal of a Jesuit middle school myself, that description still resonates strongly with me.

David Fajgenbaum, MD (Georgetown '06)

I was named a member of Alpha Sigma Nu at Georgetown University in 2006. Shortly thereafter, I became deathly ill with a rare disease called Castleman disease, had my last rites read to me, and needed chemotherapy to survive. Castleman disease is like a mix between an autoimmune disease and a cancer. I went on to have several relapses before I dedicated my life to fighting back and was able to identify a new treatment (sirolimus) for myself. Before this drug, I had five life-threatening flares in three and a half

years; now it has been five and a half years with no relapses.
