Francisco de Borja Martín Garrido, PhD Inducted: Universidad Loyola Andalucía, 2016

Francisco de Borja Martín Garrido is Director of International Relations (SIO) at Universidad Loyola Andalucía. Reporting to ULA President, Borja has contributed to the founding process of the first southern Spain private non-profit university. He works directing and facilitating global strategic partnerships within the Jesuit higher education

institution and is the founding AΣN Chapter Adviser. He is also part of the steering committee of IAJU (International Association of Jesuit Universities) and chair of Magis Exchange. He is currently the Director of Extenda Chair in Internationalisation. Borja is part of the Leadership of EAIE (European Association of International Education) and serves at the Conference Program Committee. He joined Loyola Andalucía after eight years working in international trade at Williams and Humbert. He holds Bachelor's degrees in Business Administration, a Master in International Trade and he is a registered lawyer in Spain. He also holds an International PhD in Economics from ETEA-Universidad de Córdoba, Spain with a research stay at Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles, California.

Richard Lindquist, CFA Inducted: Boston College, 1981

Richard J Lindquist CFA is a Managing Director at Morgan Stanley Investment Management and the lead Portfolio Manager on the High Yield team. He joined the firm in 2011 and has 39 years of investment experience. Prior to joining Morgan Stanley, Richard was a managing director and co-head of U.S. High Yield at Guggenheim Partners responsible for portfolio management, asset gathering, client service and overseeing all high yield trading. Previously, he was a managing director and head of the U.S. and Global High Yield Fixed Income team responsible for managing the firm's high yield assets for pension funds, mutual funds and insurance companies, as well as globally marketing the strategy and servicing existing high yield clients at both HSBC Halbis Partners (HSBC Global Asset Management) and Credit Suisse Asset Management. Richard received a B.S. Summa Cum Laude in finance from Boston College and an M.B.A. in finance from the University of Chicago. He holds the Chartered Financial Analyst designation.

Jennifer is the Vice President and Senior Managing Counsel with Global Regulatory Affairs at Mastercard. She advises globally on digital and crypto assets, CBDC, blockchain and other emerging digital technologies. As Mastercard's regulatory subject-matter expert in these spaces, Jennifer advises product teams and the broader organization to help navigate the evolving regulatory landscape where technology often outpaces regulation. Jennifer engages on the geopolitical implications of new forms of digital money and works to advance regulatory approaches that preserve financial stability, consumer protection and security in payments while fostering responsible innovation and expanded financial inclusion. Thank you to all who participated in our recent alumni survey. 186 members completed the brief survey which will help us plan future programming, communication, and more. The ages of our respondents grouped mostly between 21 and 30 years and 61 and 70 years, giving us an interesting look at what ages our alumni are most interested in engaging with us. As we continue to respond to the ongoing nature of the pandemic, we want to offer programming that is of interest to you. Survey respondents said they want to be involved in both virtual and in-person events, service opportunities, and faithbased events.

The content you most value includes ASN news, alumni stories, student chapter updates, and Ignatian resources. There were many great individual suggestions



including offering career and job postings, Jesuit higher education news, **networking** opportunities, and an ASN mentoring program.

ASN wants to support your search for meaningful and sustaining engagement opportunities grounded in the mission of our Jesuit honor society. Thank you for giving us this valuable feedback. If you missed the chance to complete the survey, there is still time! We will close the survey on February 14, 2022.


Take Survey





Q: How can telling one's story, deepen faith? How can it inspire others?


EC: The very act of telling your story is an act of faith: You believe that you have something worth saying, something only you can say, something that has been taking shape through the unique life experiences that you've had. And you'd be right.

To get to the point of sharing your story – whether it's a short anecdote or a documentary-length presentation –

Deputy Director of Communications, Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States means you've done the hard work of sorting through those life experiences: the good, bad, and otherwise. And the fact that you've done any such work at all demonstrates that you believe there's something in your story that has some particular importance to this moment: for you, your community, and the world.

It could be the essential work of grappling with past trauma, or an experience of profound conversion that helped you see something new in your everyday routine. Some of these stories are just for you – put them in your journal. But other stories have the ability to inspire and mobilize others because they touch on shared values, things we all know to be important and strive to live out in our daily lives. Those stories are the sparks that form social movements, that power social change, that bridge gaps in social – and familial – discourse.
