
Registration is now full. Due to an overwhelming response, the 100 spaces filled up in record time. Stay tuned for news of our next Lunch + Learn webinar in the spring.



Hear from two alumni about their paths after graduation and how they continue to live their Jesuit values



TJ Rogers (Canisius `10)

My first day at Canisius College was nerve wracking. Unsure what I was stepping into, I soon realized that just taking that first step was one of the most transformative of my life.

While I first focused on my studies, I soon got involved with student programming, eventually and inadvertently becoming president of the Amnesty International chapter. This second transformative step led to my involvement with the Undergraduate Student Association, Campus Ministry, and local nonprofit organizations.

With each outside the classroom experience, it became more clear to me that while my scholastic endeavors were important, it was in 'hands-on' learning that I thrived. Meeting people and intentionally sharing time and space with them shed light on the purpose of life. I grew to view knowledge without action as meaningless. My mindset became: if you see a problem, learn about it, and take action to remedy it. Relating to service and justice, I realized that my freedom is bound with those yearning for it. Thus, another step...

After graduation, I started at Freedom House as a Jesuit Volunteer Corps volunteer in Detroit. What was designed to be a one-year

As a senior at Wheeling Jesuit University in 2003, I attended the Alpha Sigma Nu Triennial Conference at Regis University in Denver. Perhaps the most significant outcome of the conference, personally, was the evident display of the Jesuit network in motion.

Conversation centered around the manifestation of Jesuit ideals and Ignatian spirituality, both as part of the undergraduate experience as well as beyond graduation. I was impressed by the continued commitment of many faculty, staff, alumni, and board members to the Jesuit call to be "men and women for others" and by the dialogue and interest in supporting the Jesuit network in doing so.

In August of this year, I joined the staff of the Ignatian Solidarity Network as Communications Manager. One of my first tasks in the office was to begin framing the theme of our annual report. The resounding message about ISN's work continues to be that we are a "network that networks" for justice. Alas, my tenure at Freedom House has taught me more about the world - both the good and the bad - and myself than I can put into words. As I continue on my life's journey, the flame that was ignited at home by my family was fanned by Canisius and is burning bright today... A luta continua!


