LOOKING BACK: Board President Retrospective

This October, I arrive at the end of my six-year term on the Alpha Sigma Nu Board, the last three years of which I have served as Board president.

During my time on the Board, we worked to continue the efforts initiated by past Boards to realize the full potential of Alpha Sigma Nu. We recognize that, as the honor society for students who distinguish themselves in scholarship, loyalty to the ideals of Jesuit education, and service to others, Alpha Sigma Nu is unique. We face the opportunity and the challenge of creating and enhancing our network of students and alumni from across Jesuit institutions of higher education who share a commitment to embracing Ignatian values as we go forth, setting the world on fire, each in our own ways. I am grateful for the opportunity I had to learn of the many ways that A Σ N members, both students and alumni, inspired by their Jesuit education, live out their values and contribute to promoting faith and justice in their communities.

During my Board term, we planned for and celebrated Alpha Sigma Nu's Centennial, giving us a chance to reflect on how Alpha Sigma Nu has grown and what challenges face our members today. During the Centennial, we awarded Magis Medals to 100 honorees, each of whom exemplifies scholarship, loyalty and service in their work to better the world, and who inspire us through their example. We were thrilled to

welcome our newest Chapter at Loyola Andalucia in Spain. We were challenged by the increased focus on an international outlook for Jesuit higher education. By virtue of our already-international membership, Alpha

As a Board, we worked to support our student Chapters. I enjoyed getting to meet our student leaders at the Triennials, inductions and student awards ceremonies. Through the generosity of our donors, Alpha Sigma Nu has been able to host regional leadership summits, giving our student officers from across our member universities a platform to meet, collaborate, support and inspire each other to make $A\Sigma N$'s presence felt more broadly on their home campuses. We implemented the Chapter of the Year awards, honoring those student Chapters that best exemplify A Σ N's values on campus in their programming and service projects. With the dedicated funding behind the Haig Fund Grants, Alpha Sigma Nu has been able to support student Chapter programming on our member campuses. With dedicated alumni funding behind the Seelos Grants, A Σ N has been able to support student member participation in Ignatianinspired leadership training. I have appreciated the efforts of our faculty advisers, who give of their time and talents to provide support and assistance to our student Chapters.

WALKING IN THEIR SHOES

When $A\Sigma N$ Assistant Director **Kristina Tadeo** (Marquette '15), learned of the Jesuit Refugee Service/USA's refugee simulation toolkit, "Walk a Mile in My Shoes," she knew it would make a perfect Chapter program idea to present at the fall leadership summits. Her presentation inspired many Chapters to include the refugee issue in their program plans.

The JRS toolkit guides the Chapter in creating an opportunity to pause and experience, if only vicariously and briefly, the frustrations, disappointments and hopes that refugees around the world face.

The Fordham Chapter presented "Walk a Mile in My Shoes" at both the Lincoln Center and the Rose Hill campuses. The Chapter partnered with Campus Ministry, taking 75 students through shelter, food, and health care simulation stations at each campus. "Students responded incredibly to Fordham's Walk a Mile event," states Haley Hauge (Fordham '17), Fordham Chapter President. "Because the program is interactive, each student had a different experience walking through the simulation. I appreciate my privileges and better understand the challenges refugees face on a day to day basis."

At the Seattle University Chapter, President **Nick Lovelace** (Seattle '17) reported, "Students said that this experience opened their eyes to what refugees have to go through and the conditions in which they live. That evening, we held a 'Standing with Refugees' panel discussion where panelists were able to talk about the local Seattle refugee experience." This was a collaboration between several organizations including $\Delta\Sigma N$, the International Refugee Assistance Project, the Public Interest Law Foundation, the Student Government of Seattle University, and the Student Bar Association.

At Regis University, the A Σ N Student Chapter chose to focus on refugee issues for the spring semester. "Walk A Mile in My Shoes" was the inspiration. "We felt that this spoke to the mission of $A\Sigma N$," said **Joshua Madrid** (Regis '16), Regis Chapter Co-President. "We met with Fr. Kevin Burke, SJ (Rockhurst '74), Vice President for University Mission, to discuss hosting a series of programs about the refugee crisis. Father Burke explained that Regis is the leading Jesuit institution for Jesuit Worldwide Learning in refugee camps around the world. Students in JWL are Regis students, so our initiative came together to unify and connect the main campus to all its international sites in the camps." The Chapter created programming that sought to educate and help those who are displaced. During the Chapter's annual program, 60 Second Lectures, professors lectured on Regis' moral obligation to the refugee crisis. At the "Walk a Mile in my Shoes" event, participants experienced hands-on what the daily life of a refugee is like. Finally, Concert for a Cause gave participants a chance to help raise money for Jesuit Refugee Services, specifically for the camps. "We also created videos of the students at the main campus and at the international sites and traded them, so we could all become acquainted and to build the Regis community," said Co-President Shae McGuinness (Regis '17). "In total, we raised over \$2,000 for Jesuit Refugee Services and were pleased at establishing a new relationship between students that we hope will continue well into the future."

"Our Chapter is a group of highly motivated individuals from whom I draw daily inspiration," says Chapter president Mauna Rao (Spring Hill '16).

"We are campus leaders and outspoken voices for social justice who have impacted our Spring Hill community tangibly. The positivity and cohesiveness that is our Chapter is all thanks to Father Mike. He is so integral to Chapter unity and productivity and serves as the very essence of Spring Hill's Chapter of Alpha Sigma Nu."

Two annual programs merit special mention. Father Mike and his e-board welcome new members with the induction retreat, held just prior to the induction ceremony. The team utilizes the wisdom and insight of many fellow $A\Sigma N$ members, both in person and via technology. The program includes faith-sharing followed by a talk by **Matthew Baugh, SJ** (Spring Hill '14), on the values of Jesuit education and Ignatian spirituality. The keynote speaker, **Gregory Boyle, SJ** (Loyola Marymount '90) via video, talks on the power of

boundless compassion. Members of the Spring Hill faculty and staff, **Maureen Bergan** (Spring Hill '11), **Steven Wilson, PhD** (Spring Hill '13) and Catherine Swender, PhD, share how service experiences have impacted their lives. The new inductees then hear a vocation story from a Spring Hill Jesuit. The

retreat concludes with the induction Mass with **Gregory Lucey, SJ** (Spring Hill '98), Spring Hill Chancellor.

These Chapter members then are well-prepared for executing Alpha Sigma Nu Week in March. Spring Hill College has enthusiastically embraced the $A\Sigma N$ Week concept, annually organizing events highlighting scholarship, loyalty, and service. The week opened with the Chapter attending the student Mass where $A\Sigma N$ members served as greeters, ushers, lectors, and Eucharistic Ministers.

Jamie Franco-Zamudio, PhD, professor of psychology, was chosen by the Chapter to deliver

Those honored by the inaugural Magis Medals in celebration of Alpha Sigma Nu's 100th Anniversary in 2015 are a remarkable group, inspirational for their work on social justice issues ranging from the environment to disaster relief to refugee aid as they model how to "go out and set the world on fire."

Beginning in 2018, the Magis Medal became an annual award to be presented to two Alpha Sigma Nu members who best exemplify scholarship, loyalty, and service in their work to better the world. With this annual award, Alpha Sigma Nu hopes to highlight the great work being done by fellow members living their pledge and inspire new members to carry the flame with them as they begin their careers.

Congratulations to the 2018 winners!



Douglas McCabe, PhD (Marquette '70) is awarded the Magis Medal for his involvement with Dog Tag, Inc. The organization offers transition programming that empowers the lives of veterans with service connected disabilities, military spouses, and caregivers through a fellowship program that fosters an entrepreneurial mindset in a small business environment, Dog Tag Bakery. Serving as the backbone of the fellowship program are seven business courses taught by Georgetown University faculty that comprise a non-credit certificate in business administration. Professor McCabe dedicates his time to teaching two of these courses: Principles of Management and Business Policy. The fellow population is unique and comes with an inherent set of challenges, primarily stemming from service connected injury and recovery. He has remained through graduation of six cohorts and is set to teach again for the seventh group. Dr. McCabe encourages the fellows to envision a life with a new mission and

purpose in the civilian world. His commitment is relentless, and his belief in the program's fellows is unwavering.

Dr. McCabe earned his undergraduate degree from Marquette University, his MS from Loyola University Chicago, and his PhD in industrial and labor relations from Cornell University. He is a professor in the School of Business at Georgetown University.

Nhi Pham, DDS (Seattle University '94), is a dentist, humanitarian, and visionary leader and mentor. Dr. Pham is involved in more than 10 local and international organizations. Veterans and refugees are her particular interests. Her international efforts include opening a

medical and dental clinic in Tanzania and providing dental care to Syrian and Afghan refugees. Dr. Pham models how social justice can be promoted in business. Her dental offices have a community outreach coordinator, and her employees join her on mission trips. Her clinic provides free dental care to military veterans on their annual "Freedom Day." As a 1975 Vietnamese refugee and professional woman of color, mentoring female dental clinicians and serving refugees and war veterans is not merely an academic exercise. For Dr. Pham, these servant-led practices allow her to experience the fullness of her whole self and inspire others with memory and imagination.

Dr. Pham earned her undergraduate degree from Seattle University in 1995 and her Doctorate of Dental Surgery from the University of Washington School of Dentistry in 1999.

Linda LeMura, PhD (Le Moyne '14), President of Le Moyne College, led a lively conversation on Jesuit higher education and leadership on $A\Sigma N$'s spring Lunch & Learn webinar April 19.

Her enthusiasm for her job and for Le Moyne was apparent in her sharing her story of growing up in an Italian, Catholic neighborhood in Syracuse, in her pursuit of her education and career, and in the pride her community felt at her appointment as president. Her community reminded her of the enormity of the moment, not just because she was the first lay woman to lead a Jesuit university, but also as the daughter of immigrants and of a community of immigrants.

Historical context and surmounting obstacles were the quiet themes of her talk.

Calling her experience walking the Ignatian Camino in Spain very influential in her leadership style, she described St. Ignatius's strategy of pivoting when encountering obstacles. The idea of "pivoting," to re-invent or re-think creatively in a complex environment is in the DNA of Jesuit education and is a critical skill for leaders, she explained. She sees formation as a grand conversation with a 500-year-old spirituality and pedagogy. She addressed many great questions from A Σ N members, asked as part of a thoughtful discussion.
