MAKE IT AN AΣN CHAPTER PROJECT!

Write a postcard. Create a message of hope and comfort to let a refugee know that others are thinking of them and wishing them a better future.

Tips for writing your postcard:

- Chapters may make their own postcards, use A Σ N notecards, university postcards, or city/state postcards. It's up to you!
- Keep your card simple. Sometimes just a short note and a drawing can be perfect.
- Aim for a message that will be well-received across any demographic, avoiding references that are specific to one religion, culture, or nationality.
- Refrain from including phrases such as "Welcome to America" since the recipient will be enrolled in a JRS program outside of the U.S.
- Add something personal from your life.

You do not need to pay for postage on the postcards. Collect all the postcards from your chapter and send them to:
